- * **FINE ARTS ELEC** (ART 290, KINE 280, MUGN 290, THTR 290 as well as band, choir, guitar, piano performance, etc.)
- ** **HUMANITIES ELEC** (communications, foreign language, history, literature, and transfer courses in classical studies, philosophy and religious studies)
- *****MATH 112 or higher level or STAT 200**
- ♦ **NAT SCI ELEC - Must complete both Physical Science and Life Science-6 hours of one and 3 hours of the other** (Life Sciences – biology, environmental science, plant science, & animal science at Tech or botany/zoology/biochem from other Universities; Physical Sciences – chemistry, geology, & physics at Tech & astronomy/meteorology from other Universities)
- ** **SOC SCI ELEC** (Economics, geography, political science, psychology, & sociology from Tech & anthropology, criminal justice, international studies, or interdisciplinary studies from other Universities. 3 hours must be at the Sophomore level or above)
- *** Course must provide basic instruction in the use of computer technology and/or programming
- **** Course must go beyond the basics of computer technology and may include programming or database topics
- † **DIRECTED PROFESSIONAL ELEC** - Students should consult with advisor for appropriate electives (15 hours must be at the 300-level or above)
